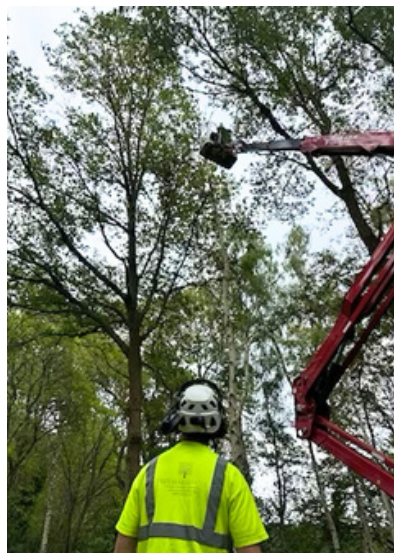

Emergency call out in Chertsey

landed on top of our clients office, causing damage to the roof. On arrival the team set up their van and chipper and began sectional dismantle using chainsaws and rope pulleys. They safely removed the branch without causing further damage to the property. This proactive measure was taken to protect the property until the client could address and repair the damage caused by the large oak tree. Wentworth Estate Cherry Picking Work

In mid June, Tree Marshalls Ltd attended essential tree works in Wentworth Estate, Virginia Water. Our team of trained arborists felled a dead silver birch at road side. The tree was removed in sectional dismantle. It was rigged down safely and carefully. The tree was located next to electric gates and therefore, the team had additional safety considerations. In early 2022, Tree Marshalls Ltd invested in a Cherry Picker Hinowa 20.10. It has certainly made our operations smoother and safer.

Our top tips for June

Pruning and Training

- Prune deciduous magnolias in midsummer to prevent dieback or bleeding.
- Clip evergreen hedges such as privet, box, and Lonicera nitida if needed.
- Thin out new shoots on trees and shrubs pruned in winter to prevent overcrowding and stimulate growth.

Planting and Moving

- Plant containerised trees and shrubs in moist soil.
- Avoid planting in dry, sun effected areas, its best to wait until autumn instead.

General Maintenance

- Ensure newly planted trees and shrubs are regularly watered, we recommend rain water where possible.
- Loosen tight tree ties.
- Sprinkle fertiliser around perennials, shrubs, and roses.

Pest and Disease Watch

- Check roses for blackspot, aphids, and sawfly damage.
- Inspect for beetle grubs and remove by hand.
- Watch for Phytophthora root rot on trees and shrubs. It can cause die back on mature trees.
- Check box and holly trees for blight.
- Remove damaged branches from deciduous trees to ensure your outdoor space is safe for the months ahead.
- Manage caterpillars, aphids, and fly pests by hand or encourage natural predators such as blue tits.
